All voters must complete a Declaration of Voter Qualification form before voting. You may download the form and bring the completed copy with you to the polls. Copies will be available at the polling place the day of the primary.

Candidates Discuss Local Issues at Forum

Six local Republican candidates who are seeking either CCRC nomination or endorsement met at the American Legion Hall on April 27th to participate in a public candidate forum. Candidates Russ Rabb, Missy White, Joe Watson, Paul Bates, Jon Russell, Senator Bryce Reeves, and Mike Allers introduced themselves and were asked to discuss their views on local issues faced by the elected positions they seek. Moderator Maria Basileo, editor of the Culpeper Times, asked questions that covered topics such as taxes, public safety, collaboration between elected officials, budgetary concerns, and education. No candidates for School Board were present. The forum was well attended with almost 100 attendees. This was the first forum hosted by Culpeper County Republican Committee and more of these types of events are planned for the election season.
